



Dear Friends,
Valentine's Day offers an opportunity to write a bit about the calendar of the saints of the church. While we honor the tradition of a Valentine who may have been a martyr to the Romans, February 14 is now celebrated as the feast of Saints Cyril and Methodius who are known as the apostles to the Slavs; in the ninth century they sought to unite the Eastern churches with Rome. In 1969 Valentine was removed from the liturgical calendar because there is practically no verifiable data on him. His name remains on the official list of saints including the Roman Martyrology. Also, there are many traditions about him and his relics are revered in several places though it is difficult to certify them. While historical criteria are lacking, Valentine is one of the best known of our saints due to the tradition documented in the twelfth century when Chaucer and others associated him with inspiring romantic love. In our society the day usually has little connection with the wonder and the holiness of the romance which inspires and underlies the marital commitment. However, this weekend let us give thanks for the mystery and wonder of the Sacrament of Matrimony and pray that its grace sustain spouses and families.
