

FROM THE  Dear Friends,

If we were asked the name of the most important church in the world, many would reply Saint Peter's Basilica at the Vatican. However, November 9 is the anniversary of the dedication of the Priest Cathedral of Saint John the Baptist and Saint John the Evangelist in Rome which is considered the head and mother of all churches. While it is commonly known under the name of Saint John, it is firstly and formally dedicated to the Most Holy Savior. The name, Lateran, has been added because the church sits on the property of the Laterani family. The Emperor Constantine gave it to the Pope. The anniversary supplants the usual Sunday observance because of the importance of the church. We are reminded that our church is not just a particular community in a single place. Rather our identity is realized in the catholicity and universality of our faith. Through our bishop we are linked to the Bishop of Rome who presides over this world wide community. Observances such as this can be helpful as we face the challenge of molding three parishes into a single parish. While each of the four churches is distinctive and while each of the current nine Masses have communities identified with them, our realization of the universality of our faith and our common allegiance to the Most Holy Savior will assist us to meet the necessary and inevitable changes before us.
